Theegarten-Pactec specialises in the development and manufacture of packaging machines for small pieced confectionery items. The diversity of over twenty packaging styles is combined with a wide performance range, covering low speed (up to 500 products/minute) and medium speed systems (up to 1,000 products/minute) as well as continuous motion high-performance machines in the speed range above 1,000 products/minute. In addition to single machines, the company also offers the engineering, design and supply of complete packaging lines as a turn-key partner. Hard sugar boiled candies, toffees, chewing gum, chocolate products and baked goods as well as other food and non-food articles are wrapped.

Theegarten-Pactec, located in Dresden (Germany), is a mid-sized, family-owned company managed in the fourth generation by Markus Rustler and Dr. Egbert Röhm. Sales agencies in more than 100 countries represent the company. The export share averages 95 percent. Theegarten-Pactec supports two industry sustainability initiatives: SAVE FOOD (www.save-food.org) set up by the Messe Düsseldorf Group, and Blue Competence (www.bluecompetence.net) set up by the VDMA (Verband Deutscher Maschinen- und Anlagenbau, German Engineering Association), Frankfurt.

History

Theegarten-Pactec was created by the merger of two firms in 1994 when the Cologne-based company Rose-Theegarten took over Pactec in Dresden. Both companies look back on a long tradition in packaging machine construction. Rose-Theegarten was founded in Cologne in 1934. The name Rose traces back to a cooperation with the English machine builder Rose Forgrove. At first, Forgrove machines were distributed in Germany, and later built under license. This cooperation resulted in an in-house development for confectionery packaging machines. In the course of German reunification, Pactec in Dresden had emerged from the former GDR state cooperative Nagema, which itself was the successor to some mechanical engineering companies. The history of these companies dates back to the 19th century. At the end of 1997 the decision was made to centralise both locations in Dresden.

The new manufacturing and office complex completed in 2017 in Dresden has laid a cornerstone for the company going forward. The new building has enabled a fundamental reorganisation of operations and ensures streamlined production, thus setting in place the ideal preconditions for developing and producing innovative and high-quality packaging solutions.
